Math

In Chapter 1, we are covering exponents and perfect squares. Please have your student practice their math facts. These are used all the time. We have also begun Order of Operations. This is including review of many 5th grade concepts. Please make sure your student can get on to google classroom and see the math classroom.	In unit 1, we are diving into adding and subtracting positive and negative numbers - it's a great time to have your child help you balance your checkbook! We're also getting comfortable with those terrifying word problems that aren't so bad once you get to know them.	Chapter 1 is all about solving equations. This week we are focused on multiple step equations and equations with variables on both sides of the equation. Homework is assigned Monday through Thursday. At the end of each section there will be homework assigned and at the end of each chapter there will a chapter test.
