

Math 6

We are studying percents, decimals and fractions. We are reviewing percent to a fraction and putting it in simplest form. We are going from fraction to decimals and percents in class and will be practicing more next week. On Thursday and Friday, we are doing MAPs testing. This will test their growth this year.

Please also make sure your student does not forget division and multiplication of decimals. I am seeing many students get these problems incorrect. If they are struggling, send them on Mondays for extra help and we can go over this.

Math 7

This week, students are getting their Chapter 3 tests back. You can check infinite campus to see scores. For this test only, students are allowed to do test corrections and earn back a 100% instead of a 70%. Test corrections are due next Thursday.
