

Dear Parents,

Two of our freshmen boys challenged me to a debate. The class finished their study of Aristotle's Rhetoric and debates are the final. Our agreed-upon resolution was, Resolved: Children should only be allowed to use flip phones. The freshman class came to the Commons to watch the debate and a good time was had by all. I offered the resolution in the first place because so many of the student issues we encounter during the day involve their smartphones: gossip, inattention in class, sleep deprivation, depression, and defiance. In preparing for the debate, so much information came to light.

Cell phone addiction is now listed as a mental disorder in the 5th Edition of Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders. 47% of users consider themselves addicted. Many studies found the average cell phone usage to be 4.5 hours a day. 45% of users consider their phone their most valuable possession. Smartphone users have been found to have a premature thinning of the cortex, the part of the brain that processes information. It is not being suggested that children should not have a cell phone. The security and convenience of being able to communicate with your child is necessary in today's world. I do question the need to have a smartphone on their person every waking moment.
