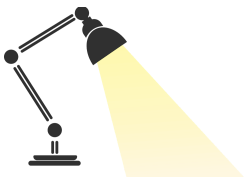

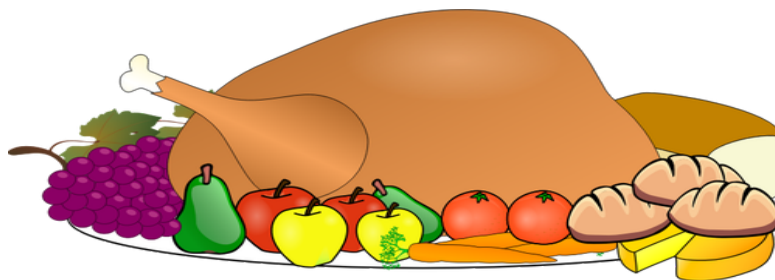
Teacher Spotlight:
