

- ★ Jefferson County School District charter school
- ★ Started in 2013 (Secondary) 2014 (Elementary)
- ★ Governed by a Board of Directors
- ★ PreKindergarten -12th Grade
- ★ Approximately 850 students (650 PreK-8th Grade)
- ★ Small Class Size 25:1

knowledge so students can then formulate meaningful questions


★ Logic Stage/6th - 8th: Builds on existing knowledge and skills, use reasoning to learn more and to more deeply understand previous learning.

★ .Rhetoric/High School (Assemble knowledge and reason to persuade others and express yourself).

Pre-K - 8th Core Knowledge Curriculum

Sequenced, specific content

- Eliminates gaps and repetitions in student learning
 Knowledge builds on knowledge spiraled
 Provides an important foundation for future learning
 - Language Arts
 - History and Geography
 - Visual Arts
 - Music
 - Science



Preschool

- Encourages curiosity, exploration and learning through hands on experiences and repetition to achieve mastery of skills.
- Lays the foundations of learning
 - following rules and routines
 - developing social skills
 - becoming independent, motivated learners
- Meets the child where they are at and gently nudges them to the next level.

Preschool Schedule

Full Day

- Opening Group (30 mins)
- Centers (1 hour)
- Snack (twice a day ,15 mins)
- Story Time (twice a day, 10 mins)
- Small Group/Tub time (3 times a day, 20 mins)
- Nap/Rest (30-90 mins)
- Outside Time (twice a day, 40 mins)
- Lunch (30 mins)

- Opening Group (30 mins)
- Centers (50 mins)
- Small Group/Tub Time (twice a day, 10 mins)
- Story Time (10 mins)
- Snack (10 mins)
- Outside Time (40 mins)

Movement in the Classroom


Research shows that movement results in significant gains in cognitive processing, attention, motivation and memory

2.Keep your hands and feet to yourselves.


3.Respect and obey all supervising adults.
