A NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Addenbrooke Classical K-8 has received a performance grade from the state of Colorado. This “report card” of Addenbrooke’s performance (both achievement and growth) has shown that our math program is helping kids grow in math concepts. We have had an upward trend on Math since the 2021-2022 school year. In fact, our middle school growth in math has a grading of exceeds.

We have noticed that there is a slight decline in our reading scores. While the school is working on making some changes in how we deliver some of the curriculum, we are asking parents to help us put a focus back on reading. Students need time to read independently each evening. Please partner with us and find time to listen to your child read to you if they are in Kinder-Third Grade. If they are fourth grade and up, please help them find time in their day to read independently and ask them questions about what they have read. In this fast paced world of screens and stories coming at them through visual stimuli, help your child learn the importance of reading and attending to written information.

Tomorrow we will have our first Dress out of Uniform day. Students must pay a dollar to dress out of uniform and the clothing still must follow the general guidelines of our dress code (i.e. no leggings, short or torn clothing and inappropriate logos).

Nature Study Definition:

- Time spent in nature observing the natural world.
- A habit of being outdoors regularly for an extended period.
- Personal, first-hand experience is crucial.

Purpose of Nature Study:

- Awakens interest and inspires ideas about the natural world.
- Not focused on learning facts or following a rigid curriculum.
- Promotes qualities like observation, patience, reverence, and humility.



CAMPUS REMINDERS AND SAFETY

- **Please no dog on campus.** We have several students that are afraid and/or allergic to dogs. There have been several dogs on the sidewalks around camps. We have a few special occasions that we allow dogs on campus, but these are pre-approved by the administration.
- **No left hand turn out of the soccer lot from 7:15 - 8:00 am or 2:30 - 4:00 pm.** This is for safety reasons. RAISING READERS: WHAT PARENTS CAN DO

- Read together daily to build a routine.
- Engage in conversations to expand vocabulary and knowledge.
- Model reading behavior for kids to emulate.
- Point out words in the environment to encourage reading.
- Utilize the resources at the local library.
- Create a reading-friendly home environment.
- Encourage and praise children's reading efforts.
- Keep books accessible for reading on-the-go.
- Establish reading traditions beyond bedtime.
- Let kids choose books based on their interests.
- Ensure comfort while reading together.
- Use expressive voices and engage with the text when reading aloud.
- Discuss and ask questions about the reading material.
- Encourage re-reading for deeper understanding.
- Connect reading with writing by creating stories together.
- Integrate technology that aids learning.
- Seek professional help for any concerns about language development.
- Relate life experiences to books for a richer reading experience.
- Make reading enjoyable by trying different activities and approaches.
- Foster a love for learning and exploration through reading.

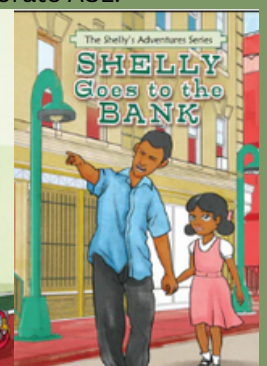
During the experience, students will be part of an interactive book reading and learn over 30 signs in American Sign Language.
